Ezenith Education had organised a five day automobile internship in the month of July at New Horizon College of Engineering, Bangalore. Seven students from our college participated and passed with flying colours. The workshop comprised of 2 days of theoretical sessions and



during the next couple of days, students were given the opportunity to have a hands on experience in dissembling and assembling engines. A three cylinder 800 cc Suzuki engine, a four cylinder 1.3 L Fiat engine and a 150 cc Bajaj engine were given for disassembly. All processes were timed and most of the teams could keep it under 90 minutes for the car engine and 60 minutes for the bike engine. It was a tiresome, gruesome and exhausting process. Nevertheless, an unbelievable experience.

On day 5, students had to submit a project report along with their groups on a topic which was given at the starting of the workshop. And ours for instance was "Developing a 300cc bike engine to deliver both power and performance". "All in all, it was a very good experience and all of us who qualified and are looking forward to attend the level-2 of the course to be held at IIT Bombay!", says a student, who attended the workshop.
